After an initial consultation Mr Anandan advised that I could have the cataracts removed from both of my eyes and the lenses replaced with 'corrective' lenses. I agreed and I have recently had the surgery. I was looking forward to the result but obviously apprehensive about the surgery as I'm sure anyone would be, the thought of anyone going near my eyes was scary. I would now say don't think or worry about the procedure, it was painless and completed in minutes with just local eye drop anesthetic. All I saw during the procedure was a bright light , similar to when you have a routine eye test and Mr Anandan talked to me during the process. I had to wait a week between each eye surgery and I was in and out of hospital within three hours each time. After each eye procedure Mr Anandan kindly contacted me the next day to ensure everything was OK, and it certainly was, I could see straight away. I had to maintain a strict eye drop regime afterwards for a few weeks, steroid and antibiotic but that soon became second nature. The results are 'absolutely amazing', I have worn varifocal glasses for many years and I can now see so clearly, everything is so crisp and bright. I no longer need my glasses, I just need reading glasses occasional for very close up work / reading. Should anyone reading this be diagnosed as needing cataract surgery I would honestly confirm you have nothing to fear, it's life changing.
